Sperati is known to have made "die" proofs in black and in colour, as well as unused and used reproductions on genuine paper. The negative is dated March 1951 and the cliché November 1951. For comparison use any value which is printed in two colours.

Specific Tests

(i) The natural bite of typography is lacking.

- (ii) Many of the horizontal lines of shading that surround the continent do not touch the coastline in the same way as they do in the genuine.
- (iii)\*There is a flaw comprising a break in the horizontal lines of shading below the continent to the left of Tasmania down to the right arm of the "U" in "POUNDS".
- (iv) There are three constant breaks in the inner frame line at left—(a) immediately opposite the horizontal line of shading on which the word "Australia" rests,
  (b) opposite the fifth and sixth lines of shading below, and (c) opposite the tenth and eleventh lines. Both eleventh and twelfth lines of shading are shorter than the other lines.
- (v) The shading around the letters is not so regular as in the genuine.

(vi) Under magnification  $\times$  20 the colour appears patchy and unevenly applied.

(vii) There is a weakness at the head of the "2" which is too thin at the top (Plate 1).

*Note:* The centring of the Kangaroo in relation to the frame is practically identical for all reproductions as Sperati's plate of the centre had guide-lines to ensure that the Kangaroo came in the right position.

Sperati made a variety with the Kangaroo omitted.

#### CANCELLATIONS

Genuine—see Chapter IV, page 28. The machine cancellations (horizontal lines) on this denomination inevitably indicate a forgery as such machines would only be used on mail of normal size.  $\pounds 2$  postage indicates that the stamp must have been used on a heavy parcel and such packages would be hand-cancelled with a circular date-stamp.

\*The flaw described in specific test (iii) is constant on the fiftieth stamp on the left pane (2nd stamp, 9th row).

# BAHAMAS

Sperati is known to have made "die" proofs in colour as well as unused and used reproductions on genuine paper of both the 1884  $\pounds$ I and the 1902  $\pounds$ I.

For comparison of the key plate use any contemporary low value.

The genuine stamps were printed by typography, double plate, Sperati's method is photography, double plate. Both reproductions have the genuine perforation 14 comb and Watermark Crown over CA.

### SPECIFIC TESTS

- (i) The lines of shading on the point of the bust have been retouched. In the genuine only the bottom line of shading touches the outer point of the bust; in the reproduction the second line from the bottom touches the front of the bust, the third line is heavily retouched, the fourth and fifth lines are slightly retouched; none of the retouched lines follow the same parallel course as in the genuine. (Plate 1.)
- (ii) There is a small flaw joining the eleventh and twelfth lines of shading immediately under the pendant curl of the chignon.

 (iii) The top of the "N" of "ONE" has a constant flaw (Plate
 1) and the centre of the "O" of "POUND" has a defect on the inside at the top.

This imitation was made by photographing a copy of the contemporary 4d., painting out the value and thus making the key plate. The duty plate used for the 1884 £1 was used for this issue.

For comparison of the key plate use any contemporary low value.

BASIC TESTS: B, D, E, F and K.

SPECIFIC TESTS: (i) The white space on the pineapple has lost definition and the pattern of the skin looks more like a strawberry. (ii) There is a spot of colour in the vertical white space to the right of the head.
