Sperati is known to have made "die" proofs in black and he probably made used reproductions on genuine paper.

For comparison use one of the common high values.

The genuine stamp was typographed and the reproduction photo-lithographed.

The colour and paper tests are of no value as it has only been possible to examine this reproduction in the "proof" state BASIC TESTS: B, D, E and F.

SPECIFIC TESTS

- (i) There are many more black spots in the background than are to be found in the genuine, particularly over the "i" of "Freimarke" and the lower right corner ornament.
- (ii) The engine-turned background shows a greater degree of light and shade than the genuine.

Sperati is known to have made "die" proofs in black and in colour, as well as unused and used reproductions. There are three reproductions all made from the same negative. The first is dated February 1941.

For comparison use the contemporary 3 kreuzer.

SPECIFIC TESTS

Note the word "Wurtemberg" measures 18½ mm, and there is a stop after the "6" at right.

- (i) There is a defect in the outer frame line below the lower right corner ornament and a weakness below the "r" of "Frei."
- (ii) The outside frame line is rough at right.
- (iii) In the left side panel the second "D" is broken as is the "P" of "Post."
- (iv) In the right side panel the "B" is broken.
- (v) In the upper half of the figure "8" there are nine horizontal lines of shading, the eighth of which is broken in
- (vi) In the lower half of the figure "8" there are eleven horizontal lines of shading, the second and tenth are broken.

Sperati is known to have made "die" proofs in black as well as unused and used reproductions on genuine paper from which the design of another stamp has been successfully removed.

For **comparison** use one of the contemporary low values.

PRINTING

SPECIFIC TESTS

- (i) Nothing is as clear cut as the genuine.
- (ii) The pattern around the central figure has lost definition instead of the enlarged pattern appearing.
- (iii) There are two white spots in the "P" of "POST," one in the head and the other in the lower part of the upright (Plate 56). (iv) There is a white line around the point of the "2."
